<u>PSALM 99</u>

THE FIRST LESSON: 2 CORINTHIANS 3:12-4:2

Paul contrasts his ministry with that of Moses. He and we are able, thanks to Christ, to see God's plan fully. The dead letter of the Law has been replaced by the living letter of the Spirit.

A Reading from the Word of God, written in the

Second Epistle to the Corinthians, Chapter 3, beginning at the twelfth verse.

Since, then, we have such a hope, we act with great boldness, not like Moses, who put a veil over his face to keep the people of Israel from gazing at the end of the glory that was being set aside. But their minds were hardened. Indeed, to this very day, when they hear the reading of the old covenant, that same veil is still there, since only in Christ is it set aside. Indeed, to this very day whenever Moses is read, a veil lies over their minds; but when one turns to the Lord, the veil is removed. Now the Lord is the Spirit, and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. And all of us, with unveiled faces, seeing the glory of the Lord as though reflected in a mirror, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another; for this comes from the Lord, the Spirit.

Therefore, since it is by God's mercy that we are engaged in this ministry, we do not lose heart. We have renounced the shameful things that one hides; we refuse to practice cunning or to falsify God's word; but by the open statement of the truth we commend ourselves to the conscience of everyone in the sight of God.

THE BENEDICTUS LUKE 1:68-79

Blessed are you, Lord the God of Israel* You have come to your people and set them free. You have raised up for us a mighty Saviour* born of the house of your servant David. Through your holy prophets You promised of old to save us from our enemies* from the hands of all that hate us, To show mercy to our forebears,* and to remember your holy covenant. This was the oath you swore to our father Abraham:* to set us free from the hands of our enemies, Free to worship you without fear:* holy and righteous before you all the days of our life. And you, child, shall be called the prophet of the Most High:* for you will go before the Lord to prepare the way, To give God's people knowledge of salvation:* by the forgiveness of their sins. In the tender compassion of our God:* the dawn from on high shall break upon us, To shine upon those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death:* and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son:* and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning is now:* and shall be forever. **Amen**.

THE SECOND READING: LUKE 9:28-36 [37-43A]

This is the story of Jesus' transfiguration.

A reading from the Word of God, written in the Gospel of Luke, Chapter 9, beginning at the twenty-eighth verse.

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. Just as they were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, "Master, it is good for us to be here; let us make three dwellings, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah"--not knowing what he said. While he was saying this, a cloud came and overshadowed them; and they were terrified as they entered the cloud. Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!"

When the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. And they kept silent and in those days told no one any of the things they had seen.

[On the next day, when they had come down from the mountain, a great crowd met him. Just then a man from the crowd shouted, "Teacher, I beg you to look at my son; he is my only child. Suddenly a spirit seizes him, and all at once he shrieks. It convulses him until he foams at the mouth; it mauls him and will scarcely leave him. I begged your disciples to cast it out, but they could not." Jesus answered, "You faithless and perverse generation, how much longer must I be with you and bear with you? Bring your son here." While he was coming, the demon dashed him to the ground in convulsions. But Jesus rebuked the unclean spirit, healed the boy, and gave him back to his father. And all were astounded at the greatness of God.]
