ASH WEDNESDAY

Today as the Church sets out on its Lenten journey to Easter the theme is penitence. Ashes are blessed and used as a symbol of repentance. Those who wish, go to the altar rails to be marked with a cross of ashes on the foreheads.

On this day the liturgy begins as follows:

THE COLLECTS:

The following Collects should be said or sung by the President.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

THE FIRST LESSON: JOEL 2:1-2, 12-17

The prophet Joel sees in a locust plague the ultimate judgment of God, the Day of the Lord. His call to repent is appropriately ours on Ash Wednesday.

A Reading from the Word of God, written in the Book of the prophet Joel, Chapter 2, beginning at the first verse.

Blow the trumpet in Zion;
sound the alarm on my holy mountain!
Let all the inhabitants of the land tremble,

for the day of the Lord is coming, it is near—
a day of darkness and gloom,
a day of clouds and thick darkness!
Like blackness spread upon the mountains
 a great and powerful army comes;
their like has never been from of old,
 nor will be again after them
 in ages to come.

Yet even now, says the Lord,
 return to me with all your heart,
with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning;
 rend your hearts and not your clothing.
Return to the Lord, your God,
 for he is gracious and merciful,
slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love,
 and relents from punishing.
Who knows whether he will not turn and relent,
 and leave a blessing behind him,
a grain-offering and a drink-offering
 for the Lord, your God?

Blow the trumpet in Zion;
 sanctify a fast;
call a solemn assembly;
 gather the people.
Sanctify the congregation;
 assemble the aged;
gather the children,
 even infants at the breast.
Let the bridegroom leave his room,
 and the bride her canopy.

Between the vestibule and the altar
let the priests, the ministers of the Lord,
weep.

Let them say, 'Spare your people, O Lord,
and do not make your heritage a mockery,
a byword among the nations.

Why should it be said among the peoples,
"Where is their God?" '

THE SECOND LESSON:

2 CORINTHIANS 5:20B - 6:10

Paul, using himself as an example, explains to Corinthian Christians the discipline of

life and the endurance of suffering which being a follower of Christ entails.

A reading from the second epistle of Paul to the Corinthians, Chapter 5, beginning at the twentieth verse

So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. For he says,

"At an acceptable time I have listened to you,

and on a day of salvation I have helped you."

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labours, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; in honour and dishonour, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying,

and see - we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

THE GOSPEL: MATTHEW 6:1-6, 16-21

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus teaches his followers the way in which their practice of piety will be acceptable to God.

Gospeler: The Lord be with you

All: And also with you

Gospeler: A Reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew.

All: Glory to Christ Our Saviour.

'Beware of practising your piety before others in order to be seen by them; for then you have no reward from your Father in heaven.

'So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, so that your alms may be done in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

'And whenever you pray, do not be like the hypocrites; for they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, so that they may be seen by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But whenever you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you. 'And whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that

they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward. But when you fast, put oil on your head and wash your face, so that your fasting may be seen not by others but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

'Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.'

THE SERMON

THE PRESIDENT

Dear friends in Christ,
every year at the time of the Christian Passover
we celebrate our redemption
through the life, death and resurrection
of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration
and to renew our life in the paschal mystery.
We begin this holy season by remembering
our need for repentance, and for the mercy,
forgiveness and grace proclaimed in the Gospel

of our Saviour Jesus Christ.

If ashes are used, the following may be said.

We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of ashes, an ancient sign, speaking of the frailty and uncertainty of human life, and marking the penitence of the community as a whole.

Let us ask God our Father to bless these ashes to become a symbol of our intention. They have been made from the palms with which we greeted Christ our King with joy last Palm Sunday. They are a sign that we intend to prepare ourselves with penitence for Easter.

Let us pray

Lord, bless these ashes to our use
and grant that they may remind us of our
mortality
and of our need of repentance
so that we may keep Lent faithfully
in preparation for the victory and joy of Easter.
We ask this in the name of Christ our Lord.

ALL: Amen.

The President addresses the congregation.

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

The President places ashes on those who come forward, saying to each:

Repent and believe the Gospel.

And each answers:

Amen

When all have received ashes, the President facing the congregation says:

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

Having washed his hands, the President says:

Return to the Lord with all your heart; leave the past in ashes and turn to God with tears and fasting, for He is slow to anger and ready to forgive.

PRAYERS OF THE CHURCH

The Prayers of the Church are offered in this form OR in the form of The Litany of Penitence (below).

LEADER:

God our Father, we praise you that you are always ready to forgive the penitent. Bring us by your Spirit to true repentance and the joy of knowing your forgiveness. Accept, through Jesus Christ, our Lenten acts of love and sacrifice. Prepare us to celebrate His Passover and to share His risen life.

Lord, in your mercy,

ALL: Hear our prayer.

LEADER:

Father, we pray for your Church throughout the world, for N- our archbishop, and in this diocese for N- our bishop, the clergy and people. Free us from dependence on material goods and the worship of power, and from all that hinders our union with you.

Lord, in your mercy,

ALL: Hear our prayer.

LEADER:

Father, we pray for our country and all in authority. Purge our land of all that is contrary to your will. Bring us all to know Christ as the way, the truth and the life, that we may live in harmony with one another.

Lord, in your mercy,

ALL: Hear our prayer.

LEADER:

Father, we pray for all who suffer, and especially for victims of greed and violence, Make your love known to them and to those who cause suffering.

Lord, in your mercy,

ALL: Hear our prayer.

LEADER:

Heavenly Father, we commend to your loving care all who will die during this Lent. Bring

them and all the departed (or Bring us all) through the passion and death of your Son to share in the glory of His resurrection.

LEADER:

We offer these prayers in the name of Jesus Christ our Lord.

ALL: Amen.

THE LITANY OF PENITENCE

The Minister and People together, all kneeling:

THE MINISTER

Most holy and merciful Father:

We confess to you and to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed; by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

LEADER:

We have not loved you with our whole heart, and mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbours as ourselves. We have not loved ourselves as we ought. We have not forgiven others, as we desire to be forgiven. We have not forgiven ourselves as we have been forgiven.

ALL: Have mercy on us, Lord.

LEADER:

We have been deaf to your call to serve, as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit,

ALL: Have mercy on us, Lord.

LEADER:

We confess to you, Lord, all our past unfaithfulness: the pride, hypocrisy, and impatience of our lives,

ALL: We confess to you, Lord.

LEADER:

Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people,

ALL: We confess to you, Lord.

LEADER:

Our anger at our own frustration, and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves,

ALL: We confess to you, Lord.

LEADER:

Our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts, and our dishonesty in daily life and work,

ALL: We confess to you, Lord.

LEADER:

Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to commend the faith that is in us,

ALL: We confess to you, Lord.

LEADER:

Accept our repentance, Lord, for the wrongs we have done: for our blindness to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,

ALL: Accept our repentance, Lord.

LEADER:

For all false judgements, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbours, and for our prejudice and contempt towards those who differ from us,

ALL: Accept our repentance, Lord.

LEADER:

For our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us,

ALL: Accept our repentance, Lord.

LEADER:

Restore us, good Lord, and let your anger depart from us;

ALL: Favourably hear us, for your mercy is great.

LEADER:

Accomplish in us the work of your salvation,

ALL: That we may show forth your glory in the world.

LEADER:

By the cross and passion of your Son our Lord,

ALL: Bring us with all your saints to the joy of His resurrection.

The bishop, if present, or the priest, stands, and facing the people, says:

THE MINISTER:

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who desires not the death of sinners, but rather that they may turn from their wickedness and live, has given power and commandment to His ministers to declare and pronounce to His people, being penitent, the absolution and remission of their sins. He pardons and absolves all those who truly repent, and with sincere hearts believe His holy Gospel.

Therefore we beseech Him to grant us true repentance and His Holy Spirit, that those things may please Him which we do on this day, and that the rest of our life hereafter may be pure and holy, so that at the last we may come to His eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

A deacon or lay person leading the service remains kneeling and says the following instead:

Almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us all our sins through our Lord Jesus Christ, strengthen us in all goodness, and by the

Power of the Holy Spirit keep us in eternal life. Amen.

THE PEACE

PRESIDENT:

Being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

The peace of the Lord be always with you.

All: And also with you.

The President and people shall greet one another in the name of the Lord.

All glory, praise, and thanksgiving be unto you, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God, You created the world and all mankind, and of your tender mercy gave your only Son Jesus Christ to take our nature upon Him, and to suffer death upon the cross, for our redemption. He made there, by His own oblation of Himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation and satisfaction for the sins of the whole world; and He instituted, and in His holy Gospel commanded us to continue, a perpetual memory of His precious death, until His coming again.

of everlasting salvation, rendering thanks to you for the wonderful redemption which you have made possible for us in Him.

And we beseech you, O Father, to accept upon your heavenly altar this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; and to grant that by the merits and death of your Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in His blood, we and all your whole Church may obtain remission of our sins and all other benefits of His passion.

And we pray that by the power of your Holy Spirit all who shall be partakers of this holy Communion may be filled with your grace and heavenly benediction, and be numbered in the glorious company of your Saints.

And here we offer and present unto you, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy and lively sacrifice. And although we are unworthy to offer unto you any sacrifice, yet we beseech you to accept this, our bounden duty and service, not weighing our merits but pardoning our offences;

Through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto you, O Father Almighty, throughout all ages, world without end.

ALL: Amen.
