THE FUNERAL

RECEPTION OF THE BODY

The Celebrant meets the body at the door of the Church and says:

With faith in Jesus Christ, we receive the body of our brother/sister N. for burial. Our brother/sister was washed in Holy Baptism and anointed with the Holy Spirit. Let us therefore, with confidence, pray to God our Heavenly Father, the Giver of life, that He will raise him/her to perfection in the company of the Saints.

V. The Lord be with you.

R. And also with you.

V. Let us pray

O God of grace and glory, we remember before you this day our brother/sister N. We thank you for giving him (her) to us, his (her) family and friends, to know and to love as a companion on our earthly pilgrimage. In your boundless compassion, console us who mourn. Give us faith to see in death the gate of eternal life, so that in quiet confidence we may continue our course on earth, until, by your call, we are reunited with those who have gone before; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

ALL: Amen.

The Reception may take place within the Church after the Sentences have been read.

One or more Sentences may be read.

Strengthen this faith and hope in us all our days, that we may live as those who believe and trust in the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, and the resurrection to eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

At the Burial of a Child

Heavenly Father, whose Son our Saviour took little children into His arms and blessed them: receive, we pray, your child N. in your never-failing care and love, comfort all who have loved (him/her) on earth, and bring us all to your everlasting kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Father of all, we pray to you for N., and for all those whom we love but see no longer. Grant to them eternal rest. Let light perpetual shine upon them. May he/she and all the faithful departed through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

POST COMMUNION

In place of the usual Post Communion prayer, the following is said.

ALL

Almighty God, we thank you that in your great love you have fed us with the spiritual food and drink of the Body and Blood of your Son Jesus Christ, and have given us a foretaste of your heavenly banquet. Grant that this Sacrament may be to us a comfort in affliction, and a pledge of our inheritance in that kingdom where there is no death, neither sorrow nor crying, but the fullness of joy with all your saints, through Jesus Christ our Saviour. Amen.

THE COMMENDATION

The president and other ministers take their place at the body.

This anthem, or some other suitable anthem, or a hymn may be sung or said.

Give rest, O Christ, to your servant(s) with your saints, where sorrow and pain are no more, neither sighing, but life everlasting.

You only are immortal, the creator and maker of mankind; and we are mortal, formed of the earth, and to earth shall we return. For so did you ordain when you created me, saying, "You are dust, and to dust you shall return." All of us go down to the dust; yet even at the grave we make our song: Alleluia! Alleluia!

Give rest, O Christ, to your servant(s) with your saints, where sorrow and pain are no more, neither sighing, but life everlasting.



Readings



The president facing the body says:

Let us commend our brother/sister N. to the mercy of God our Maker and Redeemer

Deliver your servant, N. O Sovereign Lord Christ, from all evil, and set him/her free from every bond; that he/she may rest with all your saints in the eternal habitations; where with the Father and the Holy Spirit you live and reign, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

Into your hands, O merciful Saviour, we commend your servant N. Acknowledge, we humbly beseech you, a sheep of your own fold, a lamb of your own flock, a sinner of your own redeeming. Receive him (her) into the arms of your mercy, in the blessed rest of everlasting peace, and into the glorious company of the saints in light. Amen.

The president, or the bishop, if present, may then bless the people, and a deacon or other minister may dismiss them, saying:

MINISTER: Let us go forth in the name of Christ.

ALL: Thanks be to God.

As the body is borne from the church, a hymn, or one or more of these anthems may be sung or said.

Christ is risen from the dead, trampling down death by death, and giving life to those in the tomb.

The Sun of Righteousness is gloriously risen, giving light to those who sat in darkness and in the shadow of death.

The Lord will guide our feet into the way of peace, having taken away the sin of the world.

THE COMMITTAL

The Consecration of a Grave

If the grave is in a place that has not previously been set apart for Christian burial, the priest may use the following prayer, either before the service or Committal or at some other convenient time.

O God, whose blessed Son was laid in a sepulchre in the garden: Bless, we pray, this grave, and grant that he (she) whose Body is (is to be) buried here may dwell with Christ in paradise, and may come to your heavenly kingdom; through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The following anthem may be sung or said.

Everyone the Father gives to me will come to me; I will never turn away anyone who believes in me.







He who raised Jesus Christ from the dead will also give new life to our mortal bodies through His indwelling Spirit.

My heart, therefore, is glad, and my spirit rejoices; my body also shall rest in hope.

You will show me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy, and in your right hand are pleasures for evermore.

One or more of the following Sentences may be said.

I heard a voice from heaven, saying, "Write this: "Happy are the dead who die in the faith of Christ! Henceforth," says the Spirit, "they may rest from their labours; for they take with them the record of their deeds."

Man born of a woman has but a short time to live. Like a flower he blossoms and then withers; like a shadow he flees and never stays.

In the midst of life we are in death; to whom can we turn for help, but to you, Lord, who are justly angered by our sins?

Lord God, holy and mighty, holy and immortal, holy and most merciful Saviour, deliver us from the bitter pains of eternal death. You know the secrets of our hearts: in your mercy hear our prayer, forgive us our sins, and at our last hour let us not fall away from you.

Then, while earth is cast upon the coffin, the minister says these words:

MINISTER: In sure and certain hope of resurrection to eternal life through our Lord Jesus Christ, we commend to Almighty God our brother N. (sister N.) and we commit his (her) body to the ground; *earth to earth, ashes to ashes, dust to dust. And we beseech you in your infinite goodness to give us grace to live in your dear love and to die in your favour that when your well-beloved Son shall come again in judgment both this our brother/sister N. and we ourselves may be found acceptable in your sight. Grant this for the sake of your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

*or the deep, or, the elements, or, its resting place.

The minister may say:

MINISTER: The Lord be with you. **PEOPLE: And also with you.**

MINISTER: Let us pray.

One or more of the following prayers may be said:







Almighty God, with whom still live the spirits of those who die in the Lord, and with whom the souls of the faithful are in joy and felicity; we give you heartfelt thanks for the good examples of all your servants, who, having finished their course in faith, now find rest and refreshment. May we, with all who have died in the true faith of your holy Name, have perfect fulfillment and bliss in your eternal and everlasting glory, through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

Merciful God, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ who is the Resurrection and the Life: Raise us, we humbly pray, from the death of sin to the life of righteousness that when we depart this life we may rest in Him, and at the resurrection receive that blessing which your well-beloved Son shall then pronounce: "Come, you blessed of my Father, receive the kingdom prepared for you from the beginning of the world." Grant this, O merciful Father, through Jesus Christ, our Mediator and Redeemer. Amen.

Grant, O Lord, to all who are bereaved the Spirit of faith and courage, that they may have strength to meet the days to come with steadfastness and patience; not sorrowing as those without hope, but in thankful remembrance of your great goodness, and in the joyful expectation of eternal life with those they love. And this we ask in the Name of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Then may be said:

MINISTER: Rest eternal grant to him (her), O Lord; **PEOPLE: And let light perpetual shine upon him (her).**

MINISTER: May he (she) and all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.

PEOPLE: Amen.

MINISTER: The Lord bless him (her) and keep him (her), the Lord make His face to shine upon him (her) and be gracious to him (her) the Lord lift up His countenance upon him (her) and give him (her) peace.

The minister then dismisses the people with these words:

MINISTER: Alleluia, Christ is risen. **PEOPLE: The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia**!

MINISTER: Let us go forth in the name of Christ. **PEOPLE: Thanks be to God.**

or with the following.







MINISTER: Unto Him that is able to keep us from falling, and to present us faultless before the presence of His glory with exceeding joy; to the only wise God our Saviour, be glory and majesty, dominion and power, both now and ever.

PEOPLE: Amen.

Additional Prayers

- 1. O God, the maker and redeemer of all mankind: grant us, with your servant N. and all the faithful departed, the sure benefits of your Son's saving passion and glorious resurrection; that in the last day, when you gather up all things in Christ, we may with them enjoy the fullness of your promises; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
- 2. Hear, Lord, the prayers of your people, as we remember before you N. our brother (sister): and grant that we who confess your Name on earth may with him (her) be made perfect in the kingdom of your glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

(daughter N.) for the love and mercy he (she) received from you and showed among us. Above all we rejoice at your gracious promise to all your servants, living and departed: that we shall rise again at the coming of Christ. And we ask that in due time we may share with our brother/sister that clearer vision, when we shall see your face in the same Christ our Lord. Amen.
- 7. O God, whose days are without end, and whose mercies cannot be numbered: Make us, we pray, deeply aware of the shortness and uncertainty of human life; and let your Holy Spirit lead us in holiness and righteousness all our days; that, when we shall have served you in our generation, we may be gathered to our ancestors, having testimony of a good conscience, in the communion of the Catholic Church, in the confidence of a certain faith, in the comfort of a religious and holy hope, in favour with you, our God, and in perfect charity with the world. All this we ask through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
